## Support Later Start Times for High School Students

### High School Students Need More Sleep: 9 hours:

- ❖ Buses begin picking up students at 5:30 a.m. to meet 7:20 start times
- ❖ The nation's top sleep researchers say: "Changes in sleep and circadian regulation occurring in adolescence are inconsistent with optimal learning when morning school start times are too early (before 8:30 or 9:00)."
- ❖ Sleep is critical to learning, especially the last REM sleep (which is cut short by early alarms).
- ❖ Driving while sleep-deprived is dangerous.
- ❖ Inadequate sleep is linked with increased depression, obesity, and diabetes.

**The School Board's Transportation Task Force (TTF) recommended that FCPS change bell schedules and improve system efficiency to enable later start times for high school students. The TTF Preferred Bell Schedule (ES/HS/MS) is:**

- ❖ Most elementary schools would start 7:50-8:55; end 2:30-3:45 (Some still after 9 am)
- ❖ High schools would start between 8:35 and 8:55; end 3:15-3:45
- ❖ Middle schools would start between 9:20 and 9:40; end 4-4:30

**The TTF expects its recommendations to be cost-neutral:**

- ❖ No extra buses or drivers.
- ❖ 2006 cost estimates for similar models range from zero to \$9.2 million.
- ❖ Other schools have switched to later start times with no added costs: Arlington, VA; Minneapolis & Edina, MN; Wilton, CT; and Brevard, FL.; Albemarle, VA.
- ❖ Reengineering will improve efficiency and save money.

**SLEEP endorses the TTF recommendations, which represent a compromise among a variety of interests.**

### Middle School Guidance News



**May SOL Tests:** The purpose of the Standards of Learning (SOL) testing is to provide information about student achievement in subject areas. Scores from the tests will be used to determine whether students fail to meet standards, are proficient in meeting the standards, or are advanced in the standards.

Please plan to have your student attend school on May 27 to June 2 for SOL Testing. The testing schedule: May 27, Civics 8 and US History 7; May 28, English/Reading 8 and practice Science 7; May 29, Science 8 and English 7; May 30, Math 8 and Algebra; June 2, Math 7 and Honors Math 7. Please avoid appointments that take your child out of school during this time period. It will help your child perform his or her best if he/she had a good night's rest, a healthy breakfast, and comes to school with a positive attitude.

**Interims:** Interims will be distributed to students in their 7th period class on Friday, May 9.

**Summer School:** Fairfax County Public Schools is offering a Middle School Summer Program for students who have failed one or two core subjects (English, mathematics, science and/or social studies) or who have failed both the English and mathematics 2008 SOL test(s). The program will focus on literacy and numeracy to assist students in preparation for their next school year. The summer program will be held from July 21 to August 8 at Robinson. Attendance is required for the duration of the program.

**Waiver of High School Grades:** Middle School students taking courses that result in high school credits—Algebra or a foreign language—and do not want the end of year grade recorded on the high school transcript may have the class and grade removed from the transcript. A request to remove a course from the transcript must be made in writing to the high school director of student services.

The Athletic Training Program will be conducting VHSL Sports Physicals for next school year on Tuesday, June 10th at Robinson Secondary School. Processing begins at 4:30 PM with last appointment at 7:15 PM. Please schedule an arrival time through the athletic training clinic at number or email below, or pre-register through this web link: [www.fcps.edu/supt/activities/atp/peschedule.htm](http://www.fcps.edu/supt/activities/atp/peschedule.htm).

Now is the time to make an appointment with your doctor or to get a physical exam at school for fall sports or summer camps. A physical using the correct VHSL form (April 2007) must be completed after May 1st of this year and is valid until the end of upcoming school year.
